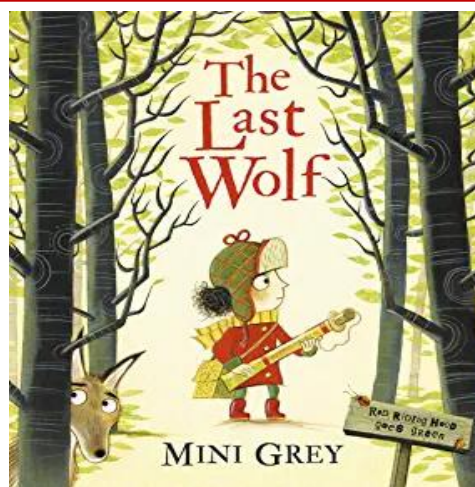

Design Technology

Freestanding Structures (linked to traditional tales)

- Design, make and evaluate a tower for Rapunzel.
- Build structures, exploring how they can be made stronger, stiffer and more stable.

Science

Animals, including humans - identify and name common animals their structure and diet

- Identify and name a variety of common animals including fish, amphibians, reptiles, birds and mammals.
- Identify and name a variety of common animals that are carnivores, herbivores and omnivores.
- Describe and compare the structure of a variety of common animals (fish, amphibians, reptiles, birds and mammals, including pets)

- Observe and describe weather associated with the seasons and how day length varies.

Technology and Invention – Caxton and Lee

- Compose a sentence orally before writing it.
- Write correctly punctuated sentences, including exclamations, using capital letter, full stop, exclamation mark or question mark.
- Leave spaces between words.
- Begin to use adjectives and nouns to write expanded noun phrases.
- Use a capital letter for the personal pronoun I.
